MISSION STATEMENT:

First, it is our mission to provide love, a sense of security, warmth and comfort to children who are seriously ill, traumatized or otherwise in need through gifts of new, handmade blankets lovingly made by volunteer “blanketeers.”

Second, it is our mission to provide a rewarding and fun service opportunity for interested individuals and groups in local communities for the benefit of children.



The Ruth Circle “Blanketeers” started making blankets in October, 2013. In the first year, we made and delivered over 700 blankets to our local Pittsburgh Chapter. These blankets were then distributed to seriously ill and traumatized children at various hospitals and emergency rooms throughout Allegheny, Butler, Washington and Westmoreland Counties.

BLANKETS MUST BE:

- New, handmade and washable.
- Blankets may be made of fleece, quilted, crocheted or knitted.
- Use child-friendly colors and patterns.
- No large, open holes or designs for little hands, feet or hospital equipment to get caught.

BLANKET SIZES NEEDED:

- 30” x 30” preemies
- 36” x 36” to cover isolettes
- 36” x 45” infant/toddlers
- 42” x 58” older children
- 48” x 72” teenagers
